Lockheed Martin Aegis Ballistic Missile Defense Weapon System Destroys Ballistic Missile In Terminal Phase. Lockheed Martin's Aegis Ballistic Missile Defense (BMD) Weapon System successfully detected, tracked and intercepted a short-range unitary ballistic missile target in the terminal phase of its trajectory during a test at the Pacific Missile Range off the coast of Hawaii.

Nation's newest high-performance space-based sensor will deliver revolutionary new global surveillance capabilities to the warfighter. A joint U.S. Air Force/Lockheed Martin [NYSE: LMT] team announced it has successfully completed on-orbit checkout of the second Highly Elliptical Orbit (HEO-2)

payload in the Space Based Infrared System (SBIRS) constellation.

Lockheed Martin and NASA Ames Team Selected to Design New Solar Mission The Lockheed Martin Space Systems Company, the NASA Ames Research Center in Mountain View, and a national and international team of co-investigators have been selected by NASA to undertake a study to design a new NASA Small Explorer Mission called the Interface Region Imaging Spectrograph (IRIS). In the recent announcement, NASA selected six missions for study. Two of them will eventually be chosen to move forward to development, with each mission capped at \$105 million.
